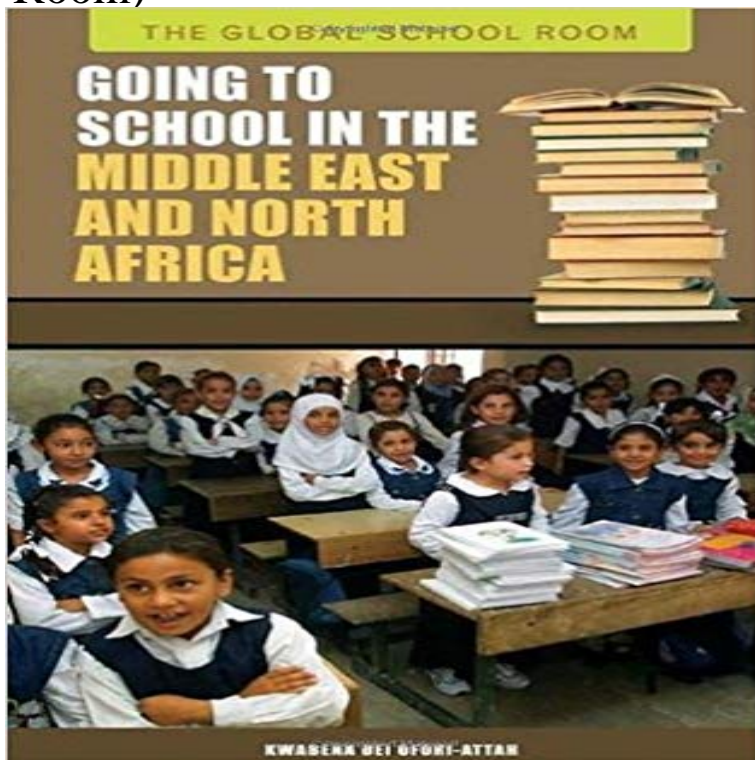


Going to School in the Middle East and North Africa (The Global School Room)
